CODE OF ETHICS

Part 1. Introduction

This voluntary code of ethics was formulated to acquaint members and non-members alike of the ethical stand agreed to by those members of The Newfoundland Club who wish to formally endorse the document and forward it to the Club Secretary for recording. It was adopted at the Annual General Meeting of The Newfoundland Club 17th. August 1991.

Part 11. Responsibility of Owners

Newfoundland owners should at all times:

1. Strive for the perfection and well-being of the breed, and by their care, training and handling of their dogs, do all they can to enhance the breed's reputation as a trustworthy family companion.
2. Properly house, feed, water and exercise all Newfoundland's in their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention when required, and give affectionate human companionship.
3. Not allow any of their Newfoundland's to roam or to cause nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out their official duties.
4. When their Newfoundland's are off their property, ensure that they are kept under effective control and subject to the local authority by-laws.
5. Honour their responsibilities to appropriately clean up and dispose of all their dogs excrement, hair etc. in public places and venues.
6. Not knowingly sell a Newfoundland to a laboratory, nor any known retail or wholesale pet dealer. Nor should stud services be provided for such persons. No Newfoundland should be sold or offered as a prize in a raffle or competition, nor auctioned.
NB: A dealer is defined as a person who regularly buys puppies in the hope of selling them for profit. A person who buys a puppy as an agent for a known individual is not necessarily a dealer.
7. Both inside and outside the show ring, exhibit good sportsmanship, and the more experienced owners and breeders shall be ready to give help to newcomers when asked to make their knowledge and experience available for the good of the breed.
8. Be aware of the Hip and Elbow Displasia problems and the desirability of screening all their Newfoundland's which are proposed to be bred from, by complying with a recognised Displasia Scoring Scheme with the aim of eradicating Displasia within the breed, and give permission for the results of the examination to be used for the purpose of any statistical research.
9. Contact the Newfoundland's Breeder immediately any matter of concern or any physical problem arises.
10. Not make untruthful statements about any other member or breeder.
11. Abide by all the rules of the NZKC and The Newfoundland Club, applicable to activities in which they engage
12. Be familiar with the Newfoundland Standard.
